What is Space Day?

- A new opportunity to celebrate New York's history in space exploration while laying the groundwork for sustained, statewide space ecosystem growth.
- 2. Taking New York from a Top 15 Space State to the Top 10 requires greater integration and visibility for the space sector, including in Albany.
- 3. There is tremendous potential for job growth and new academic & civic programming, but too often the sector is fragmented and unperforming.
- Space Day is an opportunity to take pride in our past, acknowledge the strengths & weaknesses of our present, and build a plan for a bright future.



Space Day NY 2023 Top Takeaways

- **Full day** programming 11:00 am-7:30 pm May 25th, 2023.
- Over 100 participants across 5 events from multiple regions of NY and over a dozen organizations involved.
- Participants included a diverse cross-section of society, industry professionals and interested citizens.
 - Executed a wide range of programming including a session on space finance assets & finance, STEAM kids workshop, and 2024 Total Solar Eclipse info session.
 - Key partnerships with critical NY space stakeholders, building towards future programming and collaborations.

- Lindbergh flew from Long Island and the Apollo landers were built here.
- NY astronauts from the beginning of the space industry up to the present day.

- NASA does have a facility in the state at Columbia and there is an associated economic footprint.
- Tens of thousands currently employed in space and aerospace statewide.





Long Island, NYC, Western NY, & Finger Lakes = Top 4






New York Space Companies Creating Jobs Statewide

- 1st pilot of a crewed private spacecraft (Doug Hurley)

NASA Footprints in New York

This data was gathered thanks to our intern Aayusha Singh, who has done great work mapping the ties between NASA & businesses in NY.

- NASA conducts significant climate and atmospheric research at it's Goddard Institute for Space Studies, located at Columbia University in Manhattan.
- NASA economic impacts totaled over \$530 million in 2021 and supported over 2,300 jobs in fields as diverse as architecture, propulsion, optics, and launch support. Both rank 15th nationally.



There are 37 private companies in New York with NASA ties at 70 sites across NY.

Long Island In the Lunar Age

The aviation and aerospace industry on Long Island was critical in the Race to the Moon.

Six Grumman Lunar Landers sitting on the lunar surface today were crafted in New York.

The industry still employs tens of thousands across Long Island.

The Cradle of Aviation Museum in Garden City, Long Island is home to an unflown complete Lunar Lander on permanent loan from the Smithsonian.
